At the Spring NFRW meeting, the Board voted to offer an Early-Bird Registration fee of only \$300, available for a two-week period. Keep watching NFRW emails and plan to take advantage of that Early-Bird offer when it is announced this summer.

TIP: Clubs can fundraise to help offset the cost of attending conventions, and that earns points for the Achievement Award. In addition to registration that includes some meals, expenses include your lodging at approx. \$250 a night and airfare which is less than \$500 right now.

Above all else, it is wonderful to be with other likeminded women who love God and Country and are committed to protecting our nation. And we have fun! As soon as you decide to attend, let President Barncastle know in order to get you credentialed as a voting delegate if possible.


