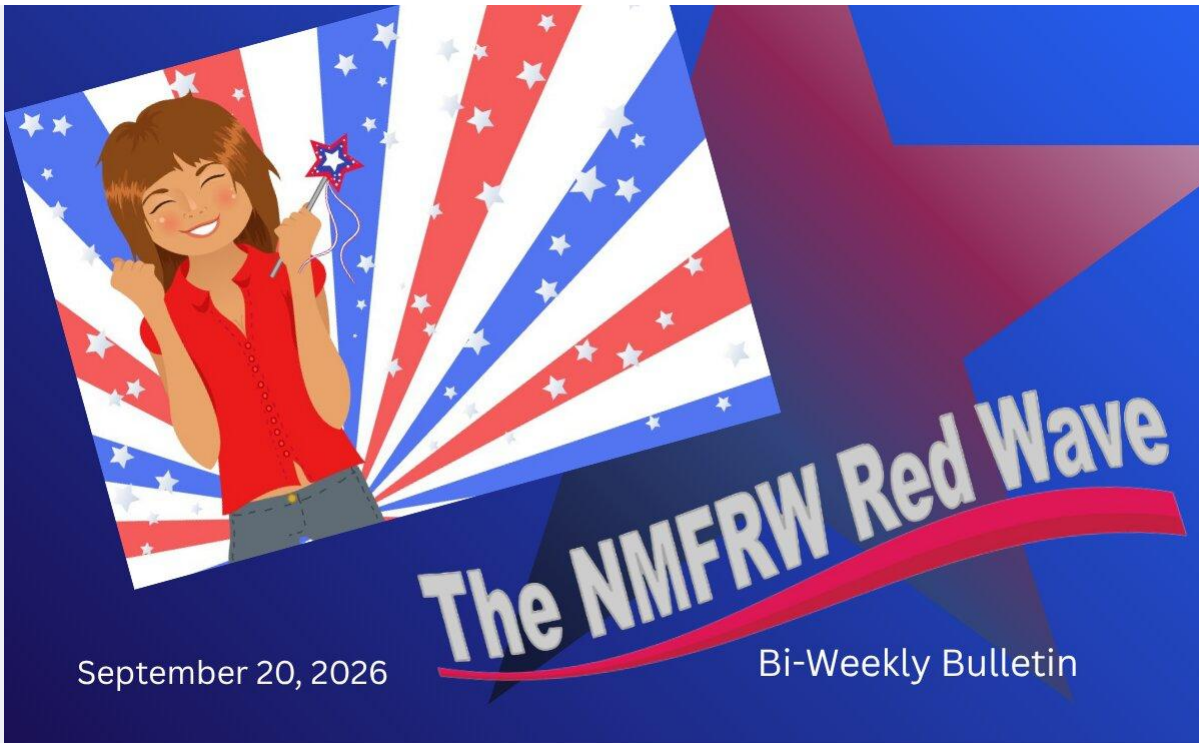




Presidents Report

It is time to begin our Membership Drive for next year. Returning Members can renew starting October 1st. and **new this year, new Members can also sign up for next year beginning October 1st and can start participating immediately!**

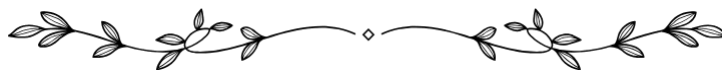
Women recruited through the Women of Influence Challenge who join between October 1 and December 31, 2026, may qualify for Early Bird Access. Early Bird Access allows eligible women to begin enjoying NFRW benefits and opportunities immediately, while their national dues are applied to the 2027 dues year.

ELIGIBILITY

To qualify for Early Bird Access:

- The individual must be a new member of NFRW or a returning member whose previous membership expired in 2025 or earlier.
- NFRW dues for the 2027 dues year must be paid and submitted to NFRW between October 1 and December 31, 2026.
- The individual must be enrolled through an NFRW club in accordance with existing membership requirements.
